A Sketchbook full of Curiosity

- 1) **Draw, Draw and Draw** some more. You can never practice this skill enough.
Ideas: Typography - Letters, street signs, textile patterns, tactile objects, still life, landscapes...
whatever takes your fancy. Try to draw daily, aim for one a week, or a series of seven. Use any media.

CRAFT - Cabinet of curiosity

- 2) Visit a gallery (see list below of what's on this summer) **Find curious things**, of interest to you and unusual. Find curious objects maximum of 5. Record the objects in curious ways.

E.g. collage with found papers such as envelopes...

Photograph the object(s) (if allowed) draw them from different views or in different styles.

Document what it is, who made it and why you have chosen it.

- 3) **Seek a Designer** in your specialist field (this is not confined to one you could look at 3). Present their work in a creative way - collage, build from Lego, drawing, photography, key analysis, annotations...

If you do not know who to select use the Gallery guide to help you or you could use the person you researched that links to one of your curious objects.
